Once, again, May is a month for volunteers at KCRC. Our annual Senior Pattern Association contest is May 17th and 18th. We need people to staff the registration booth starting at about 8:00 am on Saturday. This will include helping visitors fill out a menu order for Simms' Market for lunch and collecting money to cover that, as well as collecting the entry fee and getting pilots to sign the appropriate AMA forms. We will also need a runner to take the forms to the Market on Hardin Valley Road and then go back for the food later in the morning. We also need helpers to bring score sheets from the flight line to Joel at the scoring computer. While we already have a couple of volunteers (e.g., Joel), we will need more of you to step forward. TIA ("Thanks in Advance" for those who do not speak "computerese").

The second major thing this month is the vote on the revision to the ByLaws. We have already discussed this at meetings and they are posted on the web site. There is a mail-in ballot in this newsletter (page 3) or you can vote on line at http://kcrctn.com/bylawvote. I will put a link on the home page to make it easier. You also have the option of casting a paper ballot at the meeting on May 13th at the field.

Finally, we will be starting sound checks for engines at the field this month. We will designate a couple of weekends for checking, but we will also have the meters out there on a random basis to try to measure every plane that flies at KCRC.

The procedure is as follows (the full document on Sound is on the website):

- 2.(a) The maximum noise level of any motor shall not exceed 92 dB-A (slow) at 25 feet or 58 dB-A (slow) at the designated point on the southern boundary.
- (b) The noise level shall be the average of two sound meters and shall be recorded on a form specifically designed for the purpose and available for members inspection.
- (c) The 25' test shall be conducted over a concrete or asphalt surface and the pilot's helper shall hold the model by the tail so as not to interfere with the noise propagation. The test shall be taken with the sound me ter on the exhaust side of the model with the motor at full throttle. The meters shall be placed on a 24" high stand (2002 IMAC measurement technique).
- (d) The boundary test shall be conducted with hand held meters. In view of the difficulty in recording a sound level free from noise originating from other extraneous sources each operator must decide upon the

highest consistent noise level. The occasional peaks shall be ignored.

TIPS AND TRICKS FROM THE AMA INSIDER

Any Old Bikes Lying Around?

A good thing to use for push rods are bicycle spokes. You can find old used wheels for next to nothing and take out the spokes. They are threaded and come in different sizes.

Instant Gap Filler

To fill small gaps, instead of filling with the usual putties and waiting for them to dry, place some medium CA in the gap. Then place a small amount of baking soda on and watch it set before your eyes. It is the strongest fill I have come across and is instant.

Sandbag Weights

Fill plastic Ziploc bags of various sizes approximately ¾ full of fine sand and seal each well. Use these to hold down large parts of your airplane, such as wings, while building. The sand conforms to the shape of the parts. The bags also work well when gluing sheeting.

Cutting Corners

For a better fitting joint when using triangle stock, sand a little off the 90° corner to provide clearance for any glue fillet that may exist.

Weight Lifter


An excellent way to add ballast to the front of your model is to straighten the tab of your old tire weights, then bolt them to the underside of your engine mount. This puts the weight well forward where it's needed and where it can be clipped away with shears to adjust the balance point of the model. Do not bolt ballast to the cowls. More often then not, the little cowl mounting screws will be torn out by the vibration. Your friendly tire man will probably give you some old weights.
