PHIL SPELT KCRC PRESIDENT

This month we will talk of several things of importance to the Club.

First, KCRC will hold its annual elections in December, at the meeting on Tuesday the 9th. Four of the current people in significant positions will conclude their terms: Phil Spelt as President, Ed Hartley as Secretary, Bill Walters as Safety Officer (Guard duty calls) and Jerel Zarestky as Newsletter editor. KCRC needs you, as members, to step up and help the Club continue its long history as the East Tennessee area's leading AMA club. Joel Hebert has indicated he is willing to run for treasurer again. Our ByLaws call for a minimum of two candidates for each office, so voting members have a choice. Moreover, while the Newsletter editor is not an elected office, it is a vital position for the Club because the Newsletter presents the Club and our activities to others who are not members. Please volunteer to run for one of these offices. WE NEED YOU!!

Second, several members, including Jerel Z. and Dennis Hunt, as well as Dennis' grandson Michael Stern, and I have been discussing a new type of event for Club members. The concept is a combined scale and aerobatics event, with static and flight judging for scale, and (a) schedule(s) of aerobatics maneuvers to be flown and judged, perhaps during the scale judging session. A scale Extra 300 could take part in both portions of the event. "Rules" or guidelines for the event are open to discussion, and can be considered at the September meeting. I would envision there also being a Club cookout as part of this day, as well as some open flying and perhaps a flea market.

Finally, KCRC always does what we can to support our community. To that end, I remind us of the Marines' Mud Run on Saturday, September 13th. They use the non-runway part of the field for parking, and our pavilion and pit shelter for registration and other parts of their event. The field will be closed to flying on the 13th until the Marines and their guests are gone, usually by 1:00pm.

Also, I received a phone call recently asking if Cub Scout Troop 59 could use the field to shoot off "miniature rockets" on a Tuesday afternoon around 6:00pm. The person in charge of that event has not gotten back to me, but I indicated they would be welcome. As soon as I know something definite, I will notify our members by email.


