- The models were a smorgasbord of early seventies kits. A few years ago I saw mostly Daddy Rabbits. Then the Intruder became the one. This time, maybe there were a couple more Dirty Birdies than anything else. There were Curares, Daddy Rabbits, a Kwikfli, Intruders, Dirty Birdies, Compensators. an Oliver Twist, a Taurus version and maybe even a Kaos or two. There could have been others that I fail to mention. Craftwork on the models was excellent. My personal favorite was the Dirty Birdie of Jerry Black.

Dan Toombs stated that he enjoyed the contest very much, flying in the Novice class.
