### **Monthly Technical Article**

I have been trying to include a technical article each month usually based on my own experiences and investigations. This month will be on pilot figures.

Many of you have seen Randy's Cub with the buxom pilot, well I obtained the model of that figure from Thingiverse (https://www.thingiverse.com). Thingiverse is a repository of 3D models that are freely available for people to 3D print. While a good source it may not have the figures you want. And, some are crude and very faceted which makes for a poor print.

Recently, I discovered a program that let's one model human figures. Changing the gender, body shape, head and face shape. There are also add ons for clothing, head gear, hair that give the figure a 'non-nude' appearance. There are also poses that can be applied to the figure. The program's name is MakeHuman and is a free program for Windows, Mac and Linux (http://www.makehumancommunity.org/content/downloads.html) MakeHuman can export a file to Blender which is a free software for creating 3D models and allow the MakeHuman model to be 'posed'. (https://www.blender.org/download/) I have not learned to pose a model (but I am working on it) but I have used several poses in the MakeHuman repository to 'grow' some pilot figures.

Here are photos of 2 examples.







The gray color is from a coat of primer and I intend to airbrush the figure and make it look more realistic. I am able to scale the figures by doing the scaling when I set them up for 3D printing. Generally, the models are sent to the slicer at 1/10 scale. The figure in the photos is 1/6th scale.




The second figure is printed at 1/10th scale and the MakeHuman figure is 'dressed' in a tee shirt with a denim jacket. I did minimal cleanup on the printed figure but one can easily see the level of detail that can be achieved.

If you decide to check out these 2 programs and wish to have your figure printed, just send me the exported .STL file and I'll be happy to slice it and print it.
