KCRC's March club meeting was held at Fellowship Church on Tuesday, March 8th. KCRC officers in attendance included Rick Thompson, Richard Love, Joel Hebert, and Phil Cope. Executive Committee attendance included Jimmy Russell and Brandon Drummer. Twelve other members attended the meeting.



President Thompson introduced Rudi Heibert as a new member.

Joel Hebert delivered the treasurer's report and noted that the club had \$14,965 in the bank at the end of February. The club received \$1,272 in dues in February and the only expense was \$87 for the porta-potty.

Safety Officer Phil Cope reported that there were no safety incidents in February. He also reminded members lay chairs on their side before leaving the field to keep bird droppings off of the seats.

Phil Spelt announced that the annual Mud Run will be held on Saturday, Sept. 17th. The club approved the even by unanimous vote.

Jimmy Russell has the sanction for the SPA contest scheduled for May 21st and 22nd. Phil Spelt applied for a sanction for Cub Fest and received it on March 11th. The proposed date for the event on Saturday, June 11th was unanimously approved.

Brandon Drummer volunteered to obtain a sanction for a Fun Fly. Jimmy Russell will assist with the CD/EM (Contest Director/Event Manager) process to obtain the sanction. An event date has not yet been proposed.

Bill Dodge showed his .60-size GP Trainer powered by an OS 91 4-stroke engine. Modifications included an air scoop to help cool the engine and a reduced dihedral to facilitate roll. The original ailerons were full wing-length controlled by a single servo. He shortened the ailerons to add smaller outboard ailerons with individual servos to aid roll.
