Todd (Thomas) reported that our FRIA status was approved Thursday, September 7 (see attached letter). It is good for 4 years. Renewal applications must be submitted at least 180 days prior to expiration.

Warren reported that the SPA event brought in \$626 profit. Brandon reported that the JET event brought in \$210 and Warbird added \$185.

New Business:

There are no more scheduled events this year. Warren would like another cookout and a Float Fly if possible. A vote to have the cookout was approved. No date was set.

A big thanks to Todd Thomas for chasing this down and wading through all the paperwork. Also, thanks to the AMA folks who helped us walk through the bureaucratic maze.

Stay tuned for any updates and what you might need if you fly in a non-FRIA area. The actual

hardware is in short supply and the enforcement date has just been pushed back to March 16, 2024. The overall situation is still murky at the present time so bear with us if you plan to fly at a nonapproved field.
