I have not done much flying in the last month. The one day I did get out there were quite a few pilots present. I counted about fifteen cars. Not bad for a winter day. There have been some other nice days, but I have been tied up with working or fishing.

I have been busy in the shop with the 3D printed sport EDF Wendell Rosenbalm and I are attempting to get going. Finishing the 3D printed surface well is proving to be a bit more challenging than I thought. You would think it would go pretty smoothly but slight mismatches between parts form visible lines and a significant amount of filling at each joint is required to get it looking smooth. I am being a bit picky as this is the first aircraft I have painted in quite a while, and I would like it to look good. I am also putting the finishing touches on the big biplane. I have already dropped something on it in the shop and had to patch the covering in one spot. It takes up a lot of room in the shop, so I have to be careful about dropping tools.

Jimmy Russel proposed dates for several of the events we hope to run this year. See the minutes of the meeting for the events and dates. We can certainly do a few more so get some dates for your favorite events and propose them at the next meeting.

I am really looking forward to the time change and getting some evening flying in. I am going to try to move up to the master class in the SPA competition this year. There are a couple more power-hungry maneuvers in that pattern so I will have to be careful about the battery capacity to get it done. That will probably mean doing some of the other maneuvers at slower speeds, for example, some of the horizontal rolling maneuvers. Slow moving slow rolls and point rolls are a bit more challenging because the rudder and elevator inputs required to keep them straight increase with decreasing speed. I will be back in the same class as Jerry Black, so I won't need to worry about winning in any case. The guy is just too good.

County Lease "Programs in the Parks"

Now is a good time to wind up all those halfcompleted projects and start getting ready for Spring – it will be here before you know it!

Balsa and Stuff Storage

I wanted to have a compact place to store all my wood, wire, covering material and odds and ends so I decided to make a storage rack out of 4" square shipping boxes, some $\frac{3}{4}$ " scrap particle board and plywood, some left over $\frac{3}{4}$ " wood stock, and some $\frac{1}{8}$ " fiber board. I bought a pack of shipping boxes 4" square and 37" long like this:



They fold up like so after you tape up one end and cut off the flaps on the other:



Next, I taped them together into a 2 by 4 array, 8 total:



You can arrange however many you want to fit the space you have available. I then measured up the array and the space in a set of 24" wide by 48" deep garage shelves. I then made another holder box out of the particle board and fiber board with room on the side for bigger items and drawer on top:



After I put in the box array, I got this:



It's best to wait and build the holder box after the cardboard boxes have been assembled and taped together because the size can vary a $\frac{1}{2}$ " or so depending on the way the folding goes.

Next, I made a drawer out of the wood and 1/8 fiber board scrap for the top to hold all those odds and ends. Here it is in place:



Finally, I put all my stuff in it:



So, here is a quick way to build a holder for your long airplane materials and customize it for your particular space. If you have some scrap material left over from other DIY projects, you can recycle and save some money.
